

Funeral Today For Mrs. Autry

Bishop Quin to Conduct Burial Services for Clubwoman.

Last rites for Mrs. James L. Autry, of 5 Courtland Place, who died in Los Angeles Monday, will be held at her home at 10:30 a. m. Saturday with Bishop Clinton S. Quin officiating. Burial will be in Glenwood cemetery under direction of the Settegast-Kopf company.

Mrs. Autry, a club leader and philanthropist of Houston, was the widow of the late James L. Autry, former attorney for the Texas company. She established a portion of the Houston Tubercular hospital, the Houston Art Museum and the Autry House of the Rice Institute.

Mrs. Autry died unexpectedly Monday night as she slept in her apartment in the Biltmore hotel in Los Angeles. She had not complained of feeling ill during the day, it was reported here.

Known throughout the state for her philanthropic work, Mrs. Autry was perhaps one of the best known club women in Texas.

She was born in Corsicana and was married in that city. She and her husband moved to Beaumont in 1903 and then came to Houston, where the family has resided since 1907.

She is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Edward W. Kelley of Eugene, Ore.; a grandson, Edward W. Kelley IV; her mother, Mrs. H. E. Kinsloe of Corsicana and a brother, Ralph H. Kinsloe of Dallas.

Active pallbearers will be Craig E. Cullinan, Preston Moore, Charles C. Bell Jr., Henry Ayes, Franklin Miller and R. E. Powell.
