

Prisoners as may be brought to you
encouraging & enabling the Natives
thereby to give them Quarter. - Should
General Pignatelli Commandant
of Lago Negro be taken you are not to
receive him under British Protection
but cause him to be conveyed in the
Aurora or some other Neapolitan
Vessel, to be at the disposal of this
Government.

You are by desire of General Fox Commander
in Chief of His Majesty's Army & Minister
Plenipotentiary at this Court to abstain
from directing the operations of the
Insurgents or supplying them with
the means of carrying on the warfare
in which they are engaged, without
his express leave. but you will corres-

pond

correspond with Colonel Stocuti Majors
Guariglia, Recco and other officers bearing
the Commission of His Majesty's ally
Ferdinand IV and convey any intelligence
for them to their Government in Sicily.

You are then to proceed Northward
and extend your cruise between Naples
and the Procida Passage on the north,
and Scalca on the south for the purpose
of preventing the Enemy sending his
Flotilla or Convoys Southward in support
of his Army, or attacking Capri to
which post you are to give every
support in your power as also to Ponza
should it be attacked. It is desirable
that you move as rapidly as pos-
sible from one extreme of your
Station to the other particularly
during the night, in order that the
