RE: The two-story, 45,000 sq. ft. structure-Prison Dormitory Building

Pursuant to our meeting and conversations with you in 2005, regarding the donation of the "Old Central Prison Farm" building for preservation and restoration as a historical landmark.

We would like to secure a time and date to meet with you to discuss the donation of this building to our organization.

Our prior discussions with you and your assistant, Keith, who gave us a tour of the property, were related to preserving the structure as a Cultural and Life Enrichment Center, along with the enclosed cemetery.

We are currently ready to pursue renovation and restoration of the building. Our plans for a Cultural Research and Life Enrichment Center is to raise funds to award college scholarships to students struggling for an education.

Secondly, this would be the only Prison Museum and Cultural Research Center of this type in the Houston metropolitan area, which will depict Texas Prison history.

Support via grants, corporate/private sponsorship and donations from entities such as The Buffalo Soldiers National Museum, Brazoria County Historical Society, City of Sugar Land, Houston Baptist University, Prairie View University, Project Respect and University of Houston, will assure all of a quality reference center to explore Texas history.
