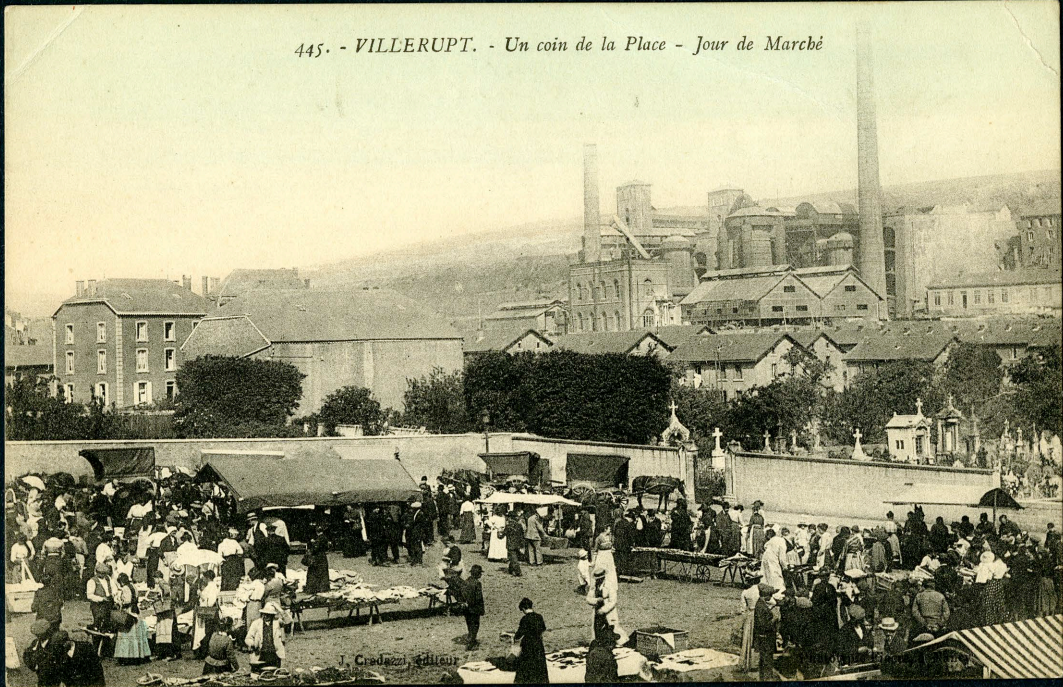

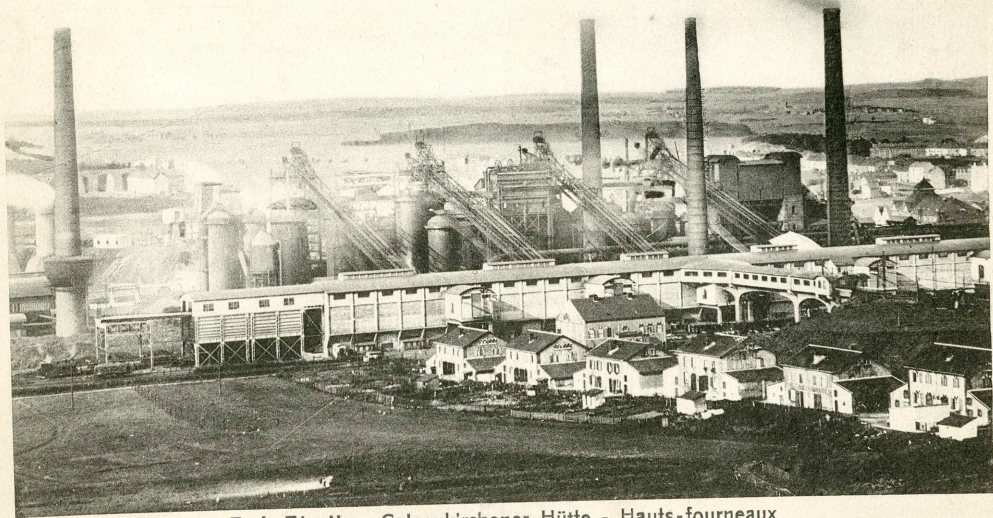

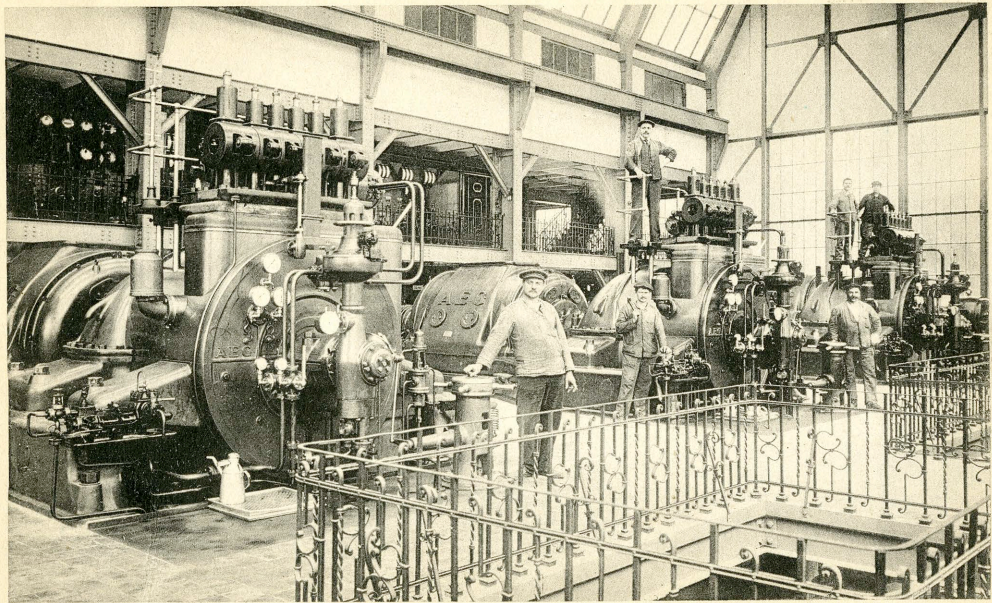
20 minutes more would have put us into Luxembourg. So to go from one country to another here - is only a matter of a very few minutes.
