WE PRESENTED TESTIMONY:

Our Teenage Pregnancy Committee Chair, Edna (Tommie) Anderson, received notice of a hearing March 29 from Tex. Rep. Mary Polk, Chair of the Select Committee on Teenage Pregnancy of the Legislature. The purpose was to identify needs and to learn about local programs. Wepresented ours and learned about others. Dr. Peggy Smith, of the Baylor /JD Goldfarb Clinic is Houston's member of the committee.

Some testimonies:

Pre-pregnancy testing is needed, but no funds are available, said a UT Medical School professor. Young women can't get on AFDC ... we need parent education in the 8th grade, basic elementary education in lower grades... schools need a pregnancy policy for schools (there's one for teachersthey're not fired if they become pregnant)..schools need to become responsible...each crop of babies costs Texas \$8,979,000,000. Each mother and child costs \$7000. The medical cost in Texas estimated for 10 years is \$118 billion. Equipment for preemies costs \$80,000...we need a van going
